

Goshawks of Berlin 2026

Trip one: 5th – 8th March
Trip two: 10th – 13th March
Trip three: 11th – 14th March

Berlin is famous for many things, art, music and museums, but one of the most impressive sights are the urban **Goshawks**. Free from persecution the Goshawks (*der Habicht* in German) have become the top avian predator in the city and are relatively tolerant of people.

Our trip focuses on these amazing birds with an emphasis on an immersive experience; achieving great views, watching their behaviour and learning about their breeding cycle. We will also be on the look out for other birds and wildlife in the areas we visit such as **Red Squirrel**, **Hawfinch**, **Short-toed Treecreeper**, **Middle-spotted Woodpecker** and **Black Woodpecker**.

| Day One (5 th , 10 th or 11 th) 1800 – 2000 Arrival at meeting venue (details of where to meet will be sent to guests early February 2025) | Group arrival. Meet your YCN guide. Followed by an evening introductory meeting to sort our plans for the days ahead. What to expect, timings, site maps etc. A chance to ask questions and get to know your guide. |
| Day Two (6 th , 11 th or 12 th) 0700 – 1630 Our first day with the Goshawks of Tiergarten in central Berlin | The best time to see Goshawks in early spring is around dawn. We will meet at 7am and spend the morning with the Goshawks in Tiergarten. Lunch will be taken in a local café close to the park followed by afternoon birding returning to in Tiergarten so we can drink in the Goshawk experience! |
| Day Three (7 th , 12 th or 13 th) 0700 – 1630 A day exploring the forests of Grunewald | A day in search of woodpeckers such as Middle-spotted Woodpecker and Black Woodpeckers. Lunch will be taken in a local café close to the forest followed by an afternoon birding in Grunewald again just in case we missed any target birds in the morning. |
| Day Four (8 th , 13 th or 14 th) 0800 – 1600 Our second day with the Goshawks of Tiergarten in central Berlin Tour finishes approx. 1600 on day four. | After learning some of the sites and experiences on the first day we will return to Tiergarten to watch the Goshawks again and look out for Hawfinches, Firecrests and Short-toed Treecreepers. Lunch will be taken in a local café close to the park. Afternoon optional group visit to the Berlin Natural History Museum to see Archeopteryx one of the most famous fossils in the world. |

Please note: The above itinerary is flexible; times and site schedules may have to be changed due to weather conditions. Your guide will focus on achieving the best possible conditions for birding and photography of the Goshawks.

What's Included:

- Expert guiding. In Spring 2026 your guide will be either Richard Baines or Mark Pearson
- Three lunches on day one, two and three with a soft drink at a local café/restaurant
- Transport costs to and from Peacock Island and the Natural History Museum
- Natural History Museum entrance fee

Direct flights to Berlin operate from London airports, Manchester and Birmingham. Alternatively, if you wish to travel overland, we can send you a suggested train route across Europe.
